What are you getting?

This really is a top-piece of kit - the body is rubber-armoured and it comes with angled-eye piece. The position of the eye-piece is unique and intuitive as it helps you naturally look into the device without having to fiddle too much with the tripod. Another top addition is the manual scope. Instead of having to adjust your scoping lens to get the perfect alignment, you can use the manual scope to target your shot perfectly and

The Celestron Ultima comes with a 80 mm refractor spotting scope with multi-coated optics and a 20-60 x zoom eyepiece. These features make it an ideal candidate for various viewing locations, such as harbours, ports fields, meadows, air shows and much more. For those like bird watching near rivers or in the rain, then luckily for you this device comes with a water-proof case that easily fits over the device, even when attached to the tripod. There is also case for the tripod. The lenses and scopes come with their own hard cases that can easily clip to your belt for portability.

Let's talk about the tripod

A very sturdy and reliable tripod that comes fitted with a spirit level. The tripod is adjustable from 64 inches at the high end and 24 inches on the low end. This means you can use it on a variety of surfaces, such as a soft ground or a table. It might not be the best tripod on the market, but the fact that it comes included is not something to be sniffed at.

Many people have commented on it's ability to view objects from as far as at least 7 miles + .
